Home Improvement Repair Program	The goal of this initiative is to secure funding for homeowners residing in low to moderate income regions outlined in the Census tract. The proposal seeks an annual allocation of \$25,000 throughout the funding duration to cover expenses linked to exterior repairs for owner-occupied residences. Under this program, eligible applicants can receive reimbursement funds of up to \$2,000.	Building Dept.	\$75,000	
Heart Monitor/Defibrillator Replacement	This project aims to replace three (3) heart monitors/defibrillators that are no longer supported for parts or repair by the manufacturer. Over the course of the next three (3) years, starting in 2024, the Fire Department intends to replace these units. Each aging unit will be substituted with a LIFEPAK 15, priced at \$45,000 per unit including accessories.	Fire Dept.	\$135,000
